CHALLENGES	
Numbers Rising: people accessing and in need of homeless services continuing to use	

No Additional Capacity in the existing system to accommodate or support the demand
Complex Needs: Poor mental health increasingly evident: Physical Health issues: Hospital discharges: low income etc
Inadequate Housing Supply to either resettle families or individuals away from homeless services

 Inadequate Housing Supply to resettle those in services out of homelessness

Without an adequate supply of housing those currently in services will not be able to move on 2 we can't prevent those who newly present from staying out of homeless services

CHALLENGES: NUMBERS RISING & NO ADDITIONAL CAPACITY

- May be as many as 50 R/S on continuous/regular basis
 Most significant cohort who are eligible for services long term homeless
- Emergency accommodation services at capacity
 Waiting list in operation for Fairgreen Hostel
 Limited scope to avail of tourist accommodation
 Hostels not suitable or appropriate for some
- Significant reliance on PEA

 - Utilising student accommodation for summer period
 Real concerns for how need will be met from mid/late August onwards

- Traveller families
 Disproportionate number in emergency accommodation
 Structural inequalities contribute to significant challenges securing housing

CHALLENGES: CAPACITY

- 60 Individuals in transilional housing need to free up spaces in more timely manner;
 - Social Housing allocations(11YTD, 3 of which were with Cluid under funding secured in 2015)
- · Referrals to transitional housing far exceeding vacancies
- Supporting those moving into social housing allocations to sustain tenancies (Tenancy Sustainment & Resettlement)

 Can be resource intensive and existing services have firely capacity
- Role of Social Work Support critical
 Anxious to see current vacancy filled at a minimum
- Health services have vital role to play
- A more proactive/assertive engagement with homeless who are engaged with mental health services needed
 Detox and rehab for people with drug and alcohol addiction need to be available and accessible

- Responding to rough sleeping
 Cold Weather Response need for a suitable property to be sourced and scope of service offering worked out
 Clarity on eligibility for a CWR bed; 'a bed for anyone who needs one'
- Rough sleepers team humanitarian response and approach to move out of rough sleeping
- Addressing blockages in emergency and transitional accommodation
 - Care and case management approach to be introduced needs to be resourced
 - Scheme of lettings to prioritise homeless
 Homeless HAP

SOLUTIONS: LONG TERM PREVENTION

- Increase capacity of tenancy sustainment and resettlement teams to respond to those in crisis
- Teams resourced to help individuals and families address debt; rent arrears; & repairs
- Access to flexible specialist staff to meet those with complex needs in their own homes
- Increase Housing Supply to secure housing stream for those requiring resettlement
- Provide residential respite and treatment services to prevent long term re-entry into homelessness

SOLUTIONS: LONG TERM PREVENTION

- · Care and Case management approach to be embedded
 - Social Work team needed
 - Health inputs
- · HAT Team needs to be established
- Develop Interagency working: Specified interagency protocols
- Mechanism for addressing Gaps & Blocks in service provision (statutory & voluntary)

LONG TERM SOLUTION: HOUSING

- Social Housing building programme
 Address issue of imbalance between family and single person housing (54% of households on waiting list are single person)
 - Only sustainable solution
- · Housing First approach to be introduced
- Access to housing: Need strategy for ensuring access to housing from all possible sources (LA; AHB; Private rental sector).
