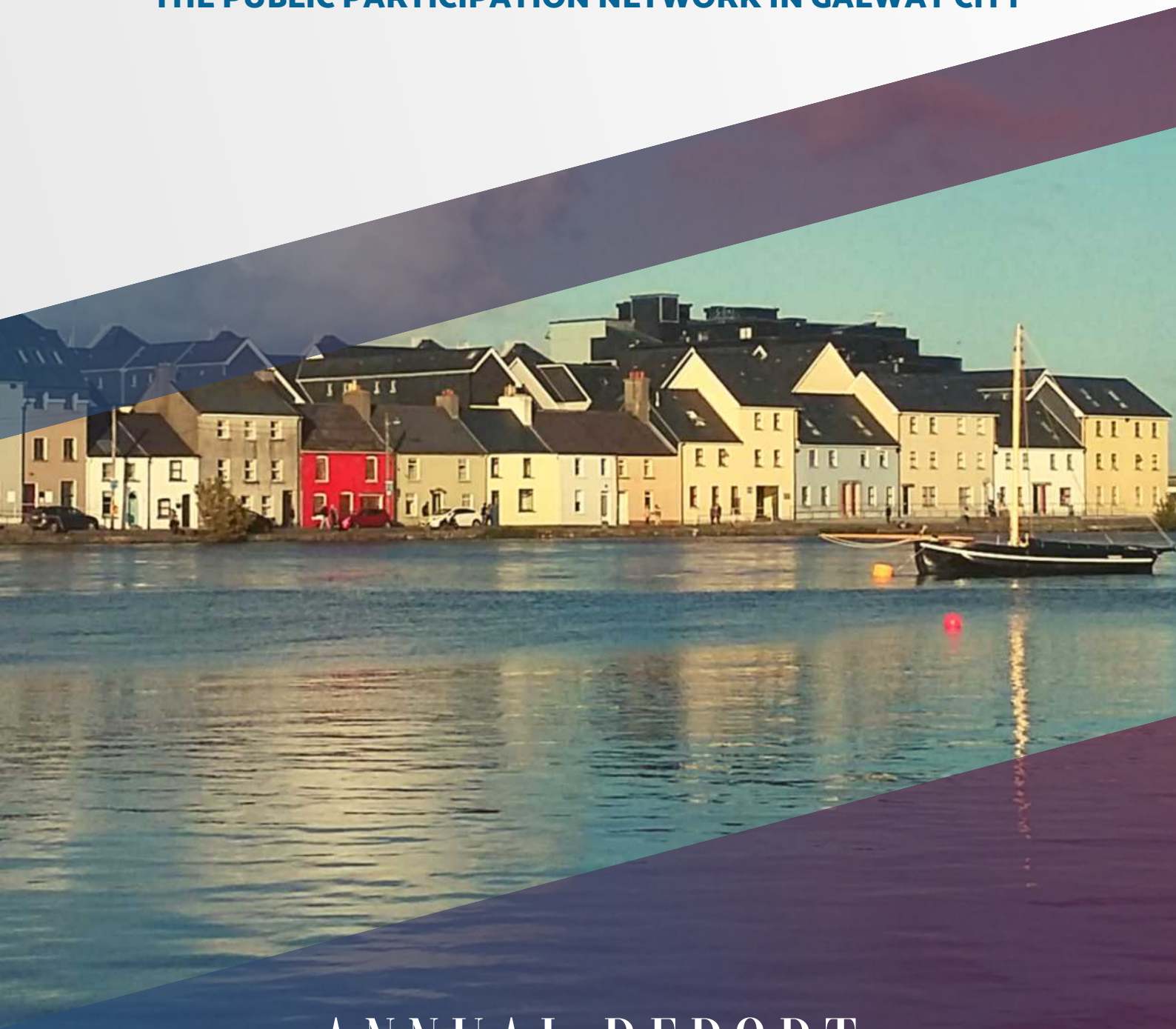

ABOUT GCCN

Background

Established in 2014 and formally launched in 2015, Galway City Community Network (GCCN) is the Public Participation Network in Galway City. The GCCN work is motivated and guided by values of:

- **Sustainability** and a concern for preserving and protecting the natural environment;
- **Equality** and a concern for non-discrimination, valuing and respecting diversity, empowering people, and securing access to social and economic resources;
- **Culture** and a concern for empowering and fostering the diversity of cultures in the city and enabling people to express their creativity;
- **Community** and a concern for the physical space, identity, and/or interests shared by a group, where people enjoy wellbeing and harmony, organise collectively, and engage in shared creativity;
- **Empowerment** and a concern for representation and participation in decision-making and democracy in the city;
- **Inclusion** and a concern for fostering and ensuring a sense of belonging to and opportunities to engage with one's community and the city.

GCCN Objectives

GCCN pursues to:

- Encourage greater participation in public decision-making which leads to more effective and better targeted policies and programmes at local level and where necessary at a regional and national level;
- Develop alternative methods and models of working which seek to directly involve and empower groups and individuals within the community;
- Support the GCCN elected representatives to achieve the GCCN policy objective;
- Act as a catalyst to influence the sustainable development of Galway City;
- To develop GCCN as a resource for the community, voluntary and environmental sectors and communities in Galway City.

GCCN AIM

The GCCN aim is to co-ordinate and support the representation of the community, voluntary and environmental sectors in Galway City.

GCCN Role

The role of Galway City Community Network is:

- To act as a platform for the groups/organisations engaged in the community, voluntary and environmental sectors in Galway City;
- To develop policy and positions on issues of common concern to the sectors and to communities and to advocate for these policies and positions to be implemented;
- To facilitate the representation of the community, voluntary and environmental sectors on the Local Community Development Committee, the Strategic Policy Committees, the Joint Policing Committee, other local government and local development bodies and any local, regional, national or international body deemed appropriate by the Galway City Community Network;
- To contribute to the development and achievement of a vision for the well-being of this and future generations.

GCCN Purpose

Galway City Community Network:

- Facilitates participation and representation of communities on decision-making bodies in a fair, equitable and transparent manner, through the environmental, social inclusion and voluntary sectors;
- Works to strengthen the capacity of communities and of the environmental, social inclusion, and voluntary groups to contribute positively to the community in which they reside/participate;
- Provides information relevant to the environmental, social inclusion and voluntary sectors and acts as a hub around which information is distributed and received.

GCCN APPROACH

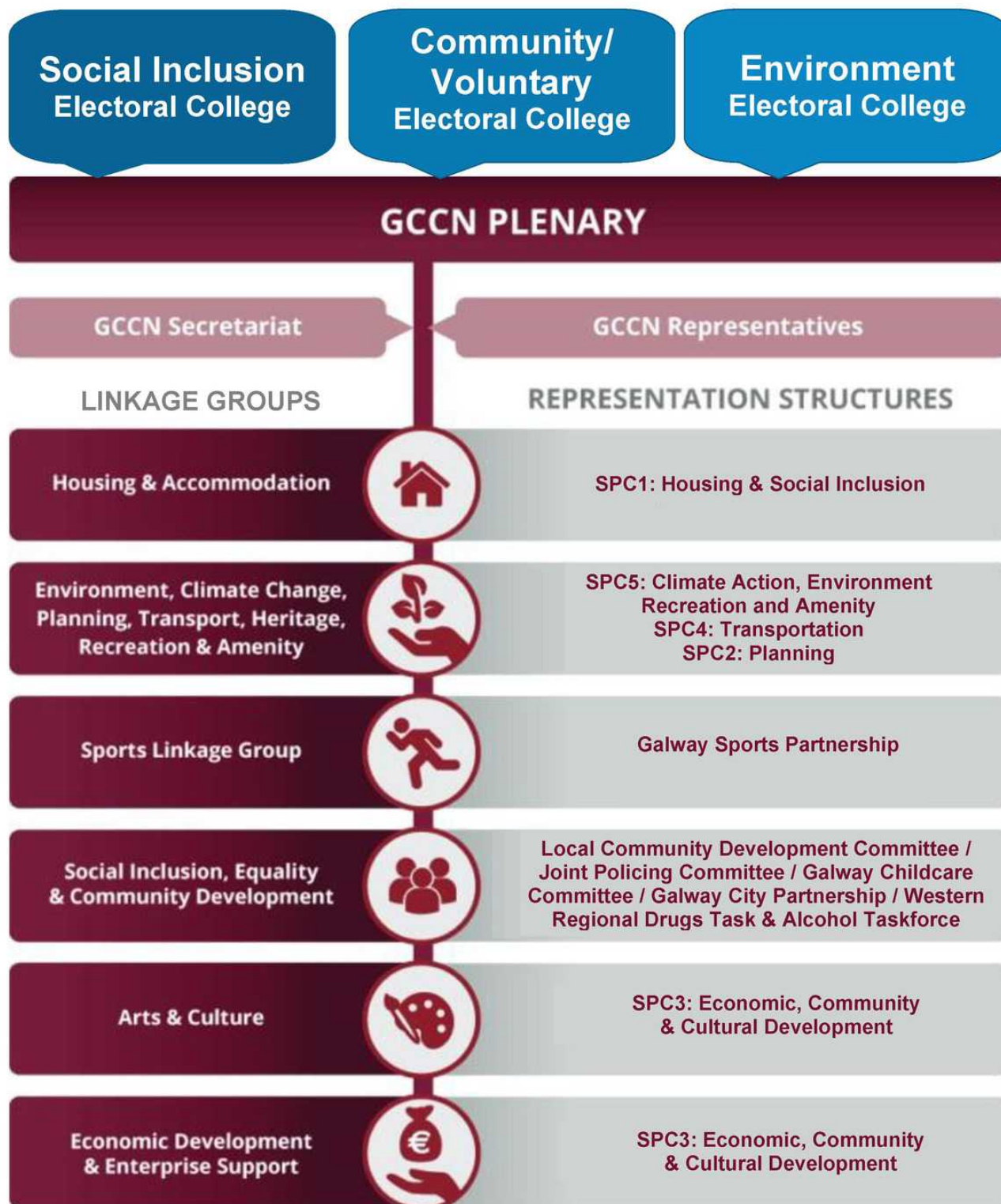
Galway City Community Network has established Linkage Groups:

GCCN Plenary Meeting - December 2019

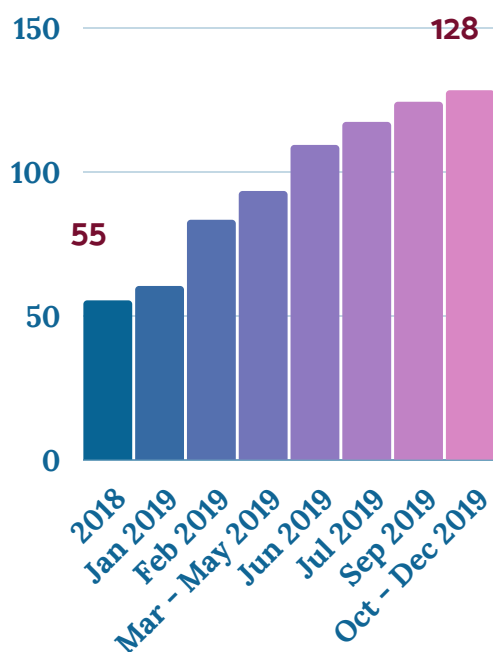

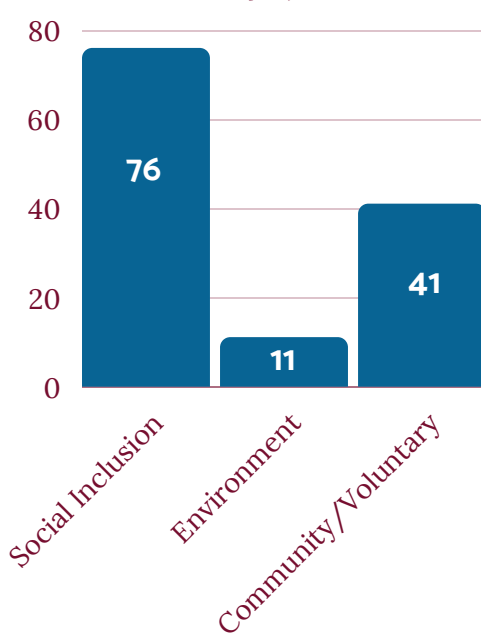
GCCN Membership

In 2019, following the transfer over to the Salesforce Customer Relationship Management (CRM) Platform in late 2018, GCCN has continued to re-engage and re-register members onto the GCCN database in compliance with the GDPR regulations.

On December 31st, 2019 there were 128 members.

Throughout 2019 GCCN staff have continued to update the membership through various means including directly engaging members by phone, presenting at network/organisation and groups meetings, use of GCCN social and digital media platforms such as Facebook and Twitter, GCCN website, group mails etc.

GCCN MEMBERSHIP

The GCCN membership is the ultimate decision-making authority and it is open to all groups and organisations active in Galway City that fulfill the criteria outlined in the GCCN Constitution[1].

The GCCN membership meets in plenary four times a year, and in 2019 the Plenary meetings were held in March, June, September and December.

The Annual General Meeting coincided with the Plenary meeting held in March 2019.

GCCN Induction

GCCN holds a number of induction meetings annually. These workshops provide an introduction to GCCN - the history, GCCN values, structures and processes.

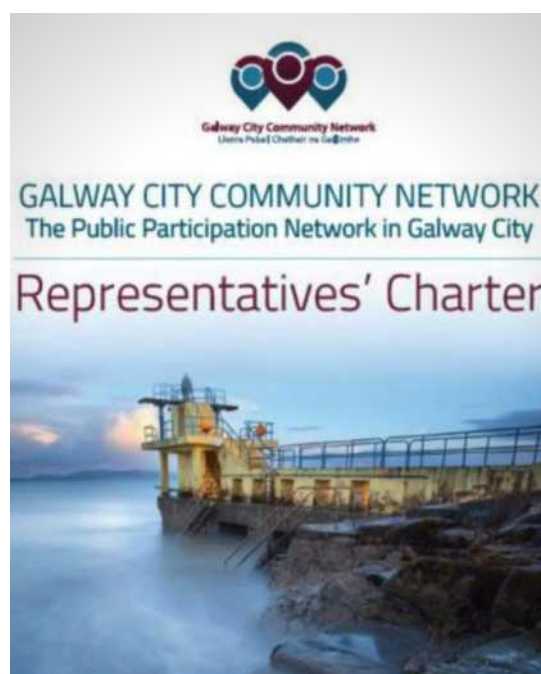
A priority for GCCN is to promote social inclusion and equality and this includes embedding these priorities in membership and representation development.

A diversity of communities, including communities experiencing disadvantage, are consistently encouraged to get involved in GCCN and are proactively targeted for these induction workshops.

GCCN Representatives

GCCN elects representatives to a variety of policy and decision-making structures in the city. Prior to the GCCN Representatives Elections held in September 2019, GCCN actively targeted members from marginalised communities and their representative organisations to act as GCCN representatives on local decision-making and policy structures.

All GCCN representatives are required to attend Linkage Group and/or Thematic Group meetings. To this end, a meeting for representatives is held before every Linkage Group or Thematic Group meeting to ensure that there is clarity and the knowledge is shared.

GCCN seeks to ensure that all representatives have an excellent understanding of their role and the GCCN positions relevant to their area of representation.

The GCCN Representatives Charter^[2] outlines the roles and responsibilities of GCCN representatives and the support they can expect from GCCN staff.

GCCN Representatives Elections

In line with the local authority elections in May 2019, GCCN held elections for new representatives onto the policy making structures associated with the local authority.

In seeking to encourage members to consider representing GCCN, in July 2019 GCCN organised an informal 'Curry and Conservations' session for those considering representation, with a particular emphasis on those that had not represented before.

The **GCCN Representative Elections** took place at the Plenary meeting held in September 2019 followed by further elections at the December Plenary.

Post-elections, GCCN organised a training session on negotiation and representation for those elected as GCCN representatives.

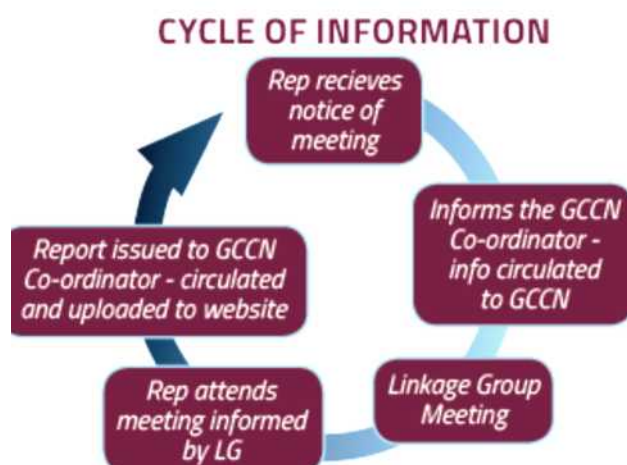

Communications

Communication and information sharing are critical areas of work for GCCN given the need and importance to keep members informed and up to date in various areas. This includes dissemination of information through social and digital media, emails and on the GCCN website.

There was a particular focus on enhancing communications in 2019.

Particular focus was put on improving the GCCN website by tackling issues of accessibility and by adding new functional features to improve user experience and to enhance the interaction that members have with the GCCN website. In addition, new visual content showcasing GCCN was designed throughout the year and a new brochure was produced.

There was an enhanced focus on the use of social media and promotion was also enhanced with regular media releases and interviews on local radio and participation in different events hosted by other organisations.

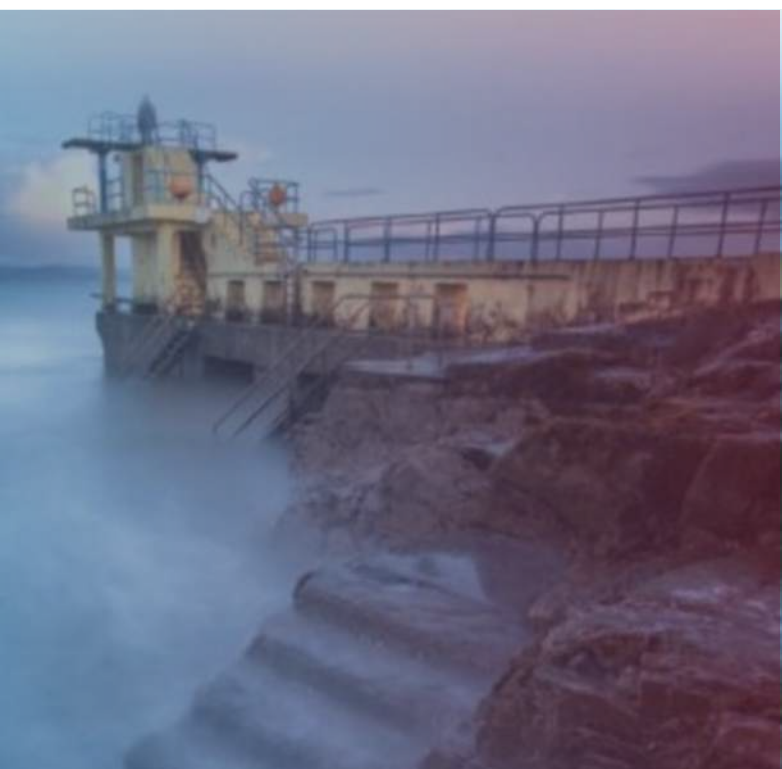

PART TWO

Policy submissions

Representing the views of GCCN members on policy development at local, regional and national level is a critical area of work for GCCN. We actively encourage and facilitate engagement in relation to making policy submissions.

GCCN actively participates in written submissions in two ways. We inform members and encourage them to make their own submissions and we request members input into formulating submissions compiled and submitted by GCCN. All GCCN submissions are underpinned by participatory processes that include workshops, Linkage Group meetings and emails requesting submissions.

Participation & Collaboration

GCCN works closely with a range of organisations and agencies in Galway City, maintaining a focus on coordinating and supporting local participation in decision making structures. A series of events and meetings were co-hosted/co-organised/participated throughout 2019 and these include:



#EqualityVotesGalway

In 2019 GCCN took a lead role in the establishment of #EqualityVotesGalway (#EVG) a consortium of local organisations, GCCN members, that work collaboratively on equality issues.

By adopting the three values underpinning the manifesto developed at a national level by the Community Platform - community, decency, participation - the #EqualityVotesGalway Taskgroup have developed a manifesto calling on all local candidates to sign an equality based pledge.

In April 2019 the consortium have organised a hustings for all local election candidates in Croí, Newcastle and urged all candidates to participate in the discussion on how to put equality at the heart of local government. Following the local elections, the role of #EVG was to hold the elected councillors to account on an equality agenda. The consortium has attended Galway City Council meetings in an observational capacity and supported members to access training on equality issues.

The organisations involved in #EVG include Galway City Community Network, Galway City Partnership, Galway Traveller Movement, AMACH LGBT Galway, Cope Galway, Threshold Galway, the Bridge Project, the Disability Federation of Ireland, Access for All and the Galway Anti Racism Network.

Public Sector Duty - Equality & Human Rights Framework

The Equality and Human Rights Statement, launched in 2018, acts as a tool to support implementation of the Public Sector Duty to have regard to the need to Eliminate Discrimination, Promote Equality of Opportunity and Protect Human Rights.

In 2019 GCCN has worked with the Galway City Local Community Development Committee, Galway City Partnership and others on a on an initiative to facilitate the production of the Equality and Human Rights Statement and the production of a toolkit to support agencies to implement their obligations under the Public Sector Duty. GCCN took a lead on a collaborative effort to establish a Civil Society Panel, the first of its kind in the country, to represent the nine grounds of the equality legislation and the ground of socio-economic status.

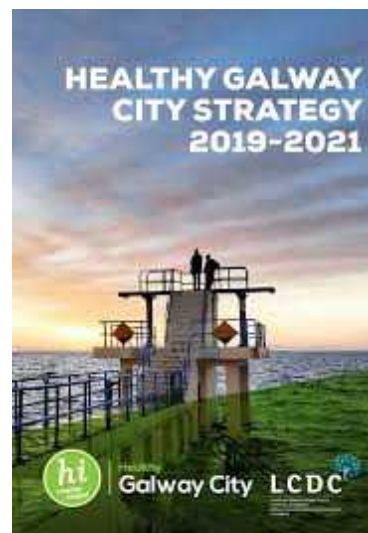


LCDC Launch of Equality & Human Rights Statement



Galway Healthy City

GCCN worked closely and collaboratively with Galway City Council, Galway City Partnership and the HSE as an active member of the Healthy Galway Steering Group in the development and implementation of the Healthy Galway City Strategy, including supporting the development of the application to the third round of Healthy Ireland funds and the implementation of the subsequent action plan. In June 2019 the Healthy Galway Strategic Plan was launched by Minister Catherine Byrne in Westside Library. Ann Irwin, the GCCN Co-Ordinator spoke on behalf of the Healthy Galway Steering Committee on this occasion.



Galway 2020

The GCCN Co-ordinator is the G2020 'Legacy Champion' for Sustainability and attended two meetings of the Sustainability 'Champions' in March 2019. GCCN continued to support Galway 2020 throughout the year.



Galway Environmental Network

In 2019 GCCN continued to support Galway Environmental Network through capacity building, organisational and overall support. GCCN remains an active member of GEN and the GEN Committee.



Galway Community Excellence Network (EVOLVE)

GCCN is a member of Galway Community Excellence Network (EVOLVE) Steering Group, whose members include Galway Volunteer Centre, Cope Galway, Saint Vincent de Paul and Galway Community Circus. This collaborative network secured limited funding to identify and source the training needs in the community and voluntary sector in Galway City. A training was held in May 2019.



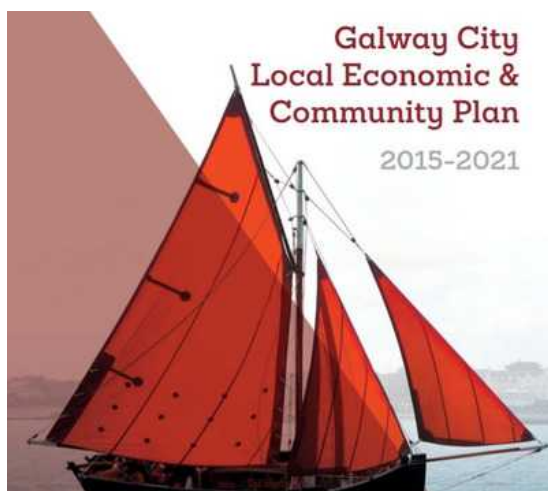
Community Enhancement Programme

GCCN co-facilitated two sessions on the Community Enhancement Programme with Galway City Council and Galway City Partnership on May 8th 2019 in Ballinfoile Castlegar Neighbourhood Centre and on May 9th 2019 in Westside Resource Centre. This was targeted at member organisations, amongst others, of GCCN.



Galway City Local Economic and Community Plan Review

GCCN worked closely with the LCDC and Galway City Council to facilitate the review of the Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) 2015-2021 and the development of a new LECP Implementation Plan 2020-2021. Galway City Council organized an initial needs assessment workshop followed by two thematic workshops. In addition to City Council's workshops, GCCN held a preparatory workshop aimed at preparing GCCN participants and requested that Galway City Council organised a third evening thematic workshop to facilitate those who could not attend the workshops held during working hours. This workshop was inclusive of the initial needs' assessments and the two thematic workshops.



National Participation

GCCN continues to collaborate with other PPN colleagues, including the sharing of resources where appropriate. GCCN participated at a national level attending meetings of the Network of PPN Resource Workers and National Secretariat Network. GCCN was also represented at the National PPN Conference held in October 2019 in Carlow and the National Integration Seminar held in October 2019 in Ballyhaunis.
