1. Confirmation of minutes of the Economic Community and Culture Development SPC meeting held on Friday 9th December 2022.

2. Matters Arising

Mr. Dave Hickey requested an update on G2020 reports. Cllr McNelis advised that G2020 reports which have recently been circulated to Cllrs can also be circulated to SPC members.

3. University of Galway – Presentation by Professor Ciarán Ó hOgarthaigh,

Uachtarán na hOllscoile

Professor Ciarán Ó hOgarthaigh gave a comprehensive outline to members of the work and impact made by University of Galway on the City highlighting unique contributions in areas such as:

- Housing & Transport
- Growing Enterprise
- Sports & Wellbeing
- Sustainability & Climate
- Social Inclusion
- Culture & Creativity
- Medtech, Marine, Data
- Cathair Dhátheangach

The presentation was welcomed by members and a questions and answers session followed on items raised. Professor Ciarán Ó hOgarthaigh concluded by asking members to continue the longstanding relationship and of being open with ideas and collaboration between the university and council; the sentiment was echoed among members and officials.

The Chair thanked Professor Ó hOgarthaigh for his presentation and attendance.

4. Failte Ireland DEDP (Destination Experience Development Plan) – Presentation by Mark O'Connell & Margaret Jenkins

Cllr Neil McNelis welcomed Mark O'Connell & Margaret Jenkins to the meeting. Margaret Jenkins, Failte Ireland Team Manager, Wild Atlantic Way introduced Mark O'Connell from Repucon Consulting, who carried out the research, to the group. Mr O'Connell then presented the findings of the research. He outlined the following information to the members.

- What is a Destination & Experience Development Plan (DEDP)
- o A DEDP is a five-year sustainable tourism development plan;
- o It captures proposed tourism development projects within one plan to maximise their potential over the next five years;
- o These projects and destination development activities are organised into an experience development framework to be adopted as a 5-year action plan.
- What are the aims of the DEDP
- o Motivate visitors to visit, stay and spend;
- o Sustainable tourism development;
- o Extend the season:
- o Disperse visitors across the destination;
- o Generate economic return for the area;
- o Focus on the strengths of the area;
- o Identify projects that will make a difference;
- Who Inputs into the DEDP
- o Visitors
- o Industry
- o Communities
- o Relevant Agencies/Stakeholders
- Who Manages the DEDP's
- o The DEDP's are managed by Failte Ireland working with a Destination Working Group to implement the plan when it is agreed.

Members thanked Mark and Miriam and there was a rigourous questions and answers session on items relating to Galway City specifically and how a DEDP can add value.

5. Galway City Culture & Creativity Strategy 2023-2027

Mr Gary McMahon, SEO presented the Galway City "Culture & Creativity Strategy 2023-2027" to the SPC. He outlined to the group the strategic priorities for Galway City:

- Creative Youth and Children
- Creative Communities
- Creative industries and Cultural Sector
- Creative Health and Wellbeing
- Creative Environment, Climate Action and Sustainability

Discussion and questions followed from members on areas such as equality and access, inclusion and queries on the "Everybody Matters" cultural strategy framework which Mr McMahon and Mr Brian Barrett addressed.

6. Galway / Gaillimh Tourism Brand

Mr Ruairi Lehmann gave presentation to the members of the new Galway / Gaillimh Tourism Branding which is due to be launched in the comping months. He requested that details of branding be kept within the group until the official launch date is finalised. Mr Lehmann outline to the meeting;

Mr Lehman outlined what the brand vision - mainly;

Mr Lehman advised this branding action is schedule of work of GCC Tourism Department working in collaboration with the Galway County Council closely.

The work was welcomed by members and many congratulated Mr Lehman and the excellent detail. Discussion and debate followed on various aspects of branding and what it will mean for Galway City and the numerous benefits.

7. Local Economic and Community Plan

Members were advised that the LECP Steering Group will meet at the end of the month where the drafted elements and document structure will be brought to members. At the next
