• Two very different crossing designs being used in the city at the same time one up at Western Distributor road and one up at Trappers

• Concerns about Trappers crossing sees buses and trucks needing to pull out into the road.

Cllr Mike Cubbard:

- Complement council on management of Croi Run also soccer matches
- Requests more information to councillors about traffic management issues prior to events councillors need that information
- Public Reps kept in the dark on road closures etc

Cllr Niall Murphy:

- Croi run went smoothly
- Streets of Galway runs with out major road closures
- Wolf Tone bridge felt very dangerous after Halloween event
- Why offering free parking? encourages people to bring cars
- Buses stuck getting from Salthill to Town
- Small events are well organised
- Bigger events needed longer road closures for them. We need a plan
 - Close roads to private cars
 - Facilitate Buses

Cllr Peter Keane:

- Thanks for presentation more collaborative the better we are smaller events particularly Pearse stadium that cause problems,
- Presentation very positive
- What involvement we have vis a vis what happened this morning? 2 car collision on bridge, large delays where is our role in that?

Cllr Frank Fahy (Chair):

- Free parking in Dyke Road every evening
- Match on Sunday walked to match home at 4
- Macnas parade lot of people with children
- GAA and Connacht Rugby need to have a chat with Galway United about parking on Dyke Road
- Parking on footpaths and impeding disabled people forcing them out on the road
- Bugbear about parking on footpaths
- Issue that needs to be addresses
- Christmas Market now extended but zero consultation
- Policing of Christmas market is a joke
- Taxi drivers discommoded so that private company can make money
- Taxi drivers can only park at ranks

• At peak hours if there is an accident the traffic will stop

Brendan Gallagher (Executive):

• In relations to the Irish Water Works on Headford road – the thought process was to do the works during the school holidays

Cross Street (as side topic)

Pat Greene (DoS):

• Put in for outdoor dining - open for deliveries - would need to bring back to emergency services - can bring it back

Kenny Deery (Chamber of Commerce):

- Cross street = lot of pain = businesses having to adapt reversing temporary closures could be a step back in terms of the city's long term goals.
- Comments that the ring road is needed.
- Is there room for a more agile management system?
- Close lanes in oncoming directions and adjust lights.
- Agile ability to deal with and react.

Cllr Mike Cubbard:

- Not here representing Galway United but a supporter of the club making out GAA and Connacht Rugby as best boys in town not the case from Coolagh road down to stadium its coned off by volunteers.
- (No?) Free parking sends out the wrong message people are coming in from outside the city late at night there is no Public Transport for them
- Will be more matches need a plan for the season free parking from 5pm instead of 6pm
- Need a plan for the season 3-4k people every second Friday.

Brendan Gallagher (Executive):

• Bohemians game seen as a test game for next season - Guards aware of what is coming - working very hard at preparing

Cllr Frank Fahy (Chair):

- As soon as no-parking cones end people park on footpaths no reason people can't park in Dyke Road
- Can walk from Dyke Road

Cllr Alan Cheevers:

• Do get GAA fans parking on Dr. Mannix Road

Cllr Niall Murphy:

- Near Pearse Stadium people blocked into houses
- Had no effect on me only need to get a percentage of people in cars
- Disappointed to hear words keep traffic flowing people don't need to cross the city
- Traffic blocks privates cars does not block emergency vehicles

Brendan Gallagher(Executive):

- Emergency services have and input
- Will table points

Cllr Noel Larkin:

- Highlighting all the problems = outer bypass is the key to traffic problems gone back to ABP because we missed the climate action plan by 4 days
- Does not see occasional rugby events (as the issue?)
- Want people to come in to the city.
- Need to expedite outer bypass
- Proposal to write to the Minister for transport to push forward the Ring Road.

Cllr Clodagh Higgins :

• Seconds proposal.

Shane Foran (GCCN): :

• Comments on Cross St

- Lower Salthill, Claddagh have the highest levels of cycling in the country outside Dublin
- The effect of the Cross Street and Flood Street changes was to push all cyclists crossing the Wolfe Tone Bridge down Merchants Road, a multilane one-way system.
- This is an unsuitable place to be pushing people on bikes

Paul O'Donnell (GCCN):

- Comments that if the ring road is wanted it will most likely have to go to EU court under IROPI and under that process it is a requirement to prove that all alternatives have been tried so we will need to show that mobility shift was attempted.
- We will be waiting many many years for the outer bypass to come regardless and whether to agree or disagree with the bypass alternatives and other measures need to be implemented.
- Can the new active travel team prepare a Mobility Shift Strategic Plan and bring it to this SPC?

Pat Hardiman (SIPTU):

- Be no big matches this side of Christmas Christmas Market if takes an hour to take a bus from Eyre Square to Westside people will not get the bus
- Asking for a meeting with Christmas Market

Cllr Frank Fahy (Chair):

• Second that

- Discussion of Letter to Minister re outer by pass

Pat Greene (DoS): :

• New EIR has been done and submitted to ABP. They have reverted to the date it was refused. This needs to be reviewed by ABP and cautioned about a need to be careful about interfering in the process. Currently there is no date for when the decision will be made..

Cllr Niall Murphy:

• Is the EIR available to the public?

Pat Greene (DoS):

• Will have to get back to you

Cllr Noel Larkin:

• Should be making noise - asked will letter to Minister interfere with the process?

Pat Greene (DoS):

• "I would be cautious, as it's on a knife edge. Maybe there are political avenues politicians can pursue." Better to go to regional politicians - rather than something in writing

Cllr Clodagh Higgins:

• Shares same frustrations - asked for a meeting with Ministers last February - we are too quiet

• Ring road is not the topic

- A lot of the standards go back as far as 2003 all say should not be done in isolation
- DMURS main document that most of those policies are quoting reducing the width of the roads will be used at the planning stage

- Don't want policy to be just follow national standards
- Kingston Road very narrow traffic at high speed
- Millers lane to XXXXX very narrow needs to signs do not overtake

Cllr Alan Cheevers:

- Thanks Fiona
- Priority is estates
- Merlin lane very high speed traffic told that feedback signs is all they can do

Shane Foran (GCCN):

• City Council executive seems to be allergic to speed ramps.

Shane Foran (GCCN):

- Ramps
- DEMURS
- Kinston road is what you will get if you follow DEMURS, lanes which would be 3M wide and buses are 2.6m wide so where are cyclists supposed to go.
- Critique of DEMURS not being fit for purpose
 - Seeking a derogation from DEMURS for the City

Responses from Fiona holland

- Didn't mention ramps but I did have it on my list.
- Pedestrian crossings are often raised,
- 2003 guidelines recommend ramps are the last option
 - Housing Estates. Are we going to do just housing estates or a comprehensive policy?
 - From a resource point of view,
 - You may or may not agree with DEMURS, but you need to take a strategic approach.

Cllr Mike Cubbard:

- Not just a policy for ramps / estates, a comprehensive traffic calming policy is needed.
- The back of Corrib Park is in need for ways to get people across the road.
- City Centre is often prioritised over the people on the outskirts.

Pat Greene

- We have to follow National Guidance to secure funding.
- We could do it bit by bit, but would need to break it up.

Shane Foran:

• Do we need a working group to help deliver this outside of the SPC meetings?

Cllr Frank Fahy (Chair):

• That can happen after June with the next SPC members.
